**As part of our 25th Birthday, we have welcomed two new Directors to the GMLPN Board.** We welcomed Andy Turner WBL Skills & Participation Development Officer at Rochdale Borough Council. Andy brings strengthened representation and insight from the local authority perspective, ensuring that GMLPN continues to reflect the priorities, challenges, and opportunities facing communities and young people across Greater Manchester. His experience further enhances the network's ability to collaborate across sectors and advocate for solutions grounded in local need. Alongside Billy Darroch, Co-Founder at Founding Futures. Billy is deeply embedded in the VCSFE ecosystem across Greater Manchester. As co-founder of UK Funding Futures, a social enterprise established to support women through skills development and employability, he has helped more than 400 women into training, confidence-building, and progression pathways in just two years. UK Funding Futures now delivers contracted programmes in partnership with four GM local authorities and the Greater Manchester Combined Authority (GMCA), giving Billy direct insight into the realities of local delivery, commissioning, and learner needs. We have held an initial roundtable with Community Providers across GM to further strengthen our membership offer for these providers.

### **Greater Manchester LSIP**

We're proud to be supporting GMCC and GMCA as they develop the second phase of the Local Skills Improvement Plan.

We have ran a number of sessions in partnership with GMCC, engaging GMLPN members to share their views on skills needs across GM to inform the LSIP including:

- Introducing the GM LSIP Phase 2 Webinar
- 2 Training Provider Roundtables
- 1 AO Roundtable
- Provider and Employer Insights Session

We look forward to seeing the final version of the GM LSIP in the coming months.

### **Supporting Apprenticeships & T Levels**

GMLPN continues to champion high-quality technical education pathways across Greater Manchester, strengthening support for both Apprenticeships and T Levels. We are proud to be a T Level Ambassador, promoting awareness and engagement among providers, employers, and learners. We are pleased to have welcomed Amaya, a Business T Level student from Oldham College, on placement with us! She's been an amazing help to the team and a great advocate of how T Level placements can work in an SME.

During National Apprenticeship Week, we delivered an Apprenticeships Explained webinar, engaging almost 200 young people, parents, and carers, and attended a roundtable with the North-West Apprenticeship Ambassador Network, welcoming Anthony Impey MBE.

We also celebrated success across the sector by attending Salford City College's Apprenticeship Awards and sponsoring Hopwood Hall College's Apprenticeship Awards, recognising the achievements of apprentices and providers across Greater Manchester.

### **Growing Support Services**

YLP continues to expand and diversify its support offer for members through guidance, research, regional insights, and peer collaboration. This includes strengthening support for providers working with NEET learners.

### **Funding, Grants & Research**

YLP is engaged in significant funded projects that support provider development and regional skills priorities, including:

- **WYCA Employer Research Extended** – West Yorkshire Combine Authority in partnership with West Yorkshire Learning Providers have now asked that we extend this to include people who have experienced dependency, offending behaviour, ex forces (veterans), women returners to the work force, returners to the workplace after a period of long-term sickness, and leavers from care.
- **CTEC Provider Directory and Post-16 Progression Campaign** – Strengthening awareness, accessibility and navigation of skills and post-16 provision through the ongoing development of the Yorkshire Apprenticeship Service Construction Search Directory, Leeds 16–18 Provision Directory and accompanying Student Success Stories campaign.

Activity includes sector-focused progression resources, learner case studies, provider video content and targeted marketing campaigns designed to raise awareness of technical, vocational and apprenticeship pathways, support informed progression decisions and increase engagement between young people, providers, employers and partner organisations across Leeds and the wider Yorkshire region - our construction directory also has a similar focus, but for construction & technology courses across Yorkshire & The Humber.

- **Misogyny in Apprenticeships Research** – contributing evidence to address gender-based barriers and improve inclusion across apprenticeship programmes. With another Trauma Informed and Restorative Practice Workshop in place for July.

- **Survey on the impact of apprenticeship announcements survey** - MP letters sent across Yorkshire and meetings scheduled in with SYMCA, WYCA, YNYCA so far

- **NEET Reduction and 16–19 Provider Support** – As part of YLP’s ongoing work to support young people at risk of becoming NEET, we are delivering a monthly 16–19 roundtable series, bringing together providers, partners and stakeholders to address key themes impacting learner engagement, progression and support. Topics include English & Maths, SEND Reform, qualification reform, safeguarding, trauma-informed leadership, Prevent, Youth Justice and referrals/signposting, alongside the publication of YLP’s sector research paper responding to the growing NEET challenge across the region.



### **Strategic partnership events including prison support and skills for care**

YLP continues to build strong, influential partnerships with local authorities, combined authorities, national networks, employer groups, and wider sector bodies, ensuring members are represented and well-positioned for future opportunities.

We had our **Prison Education Employment & Training event in partnership with Novus**. This collaborative event focused on improving prison education, skills, employability, and rehabilitation pathways by bringing together providers, employers, prisons, and sector partners across Yorkshire. Following this we are hoping to do other Yorkshire-wide events to share best practice, connect providers, and align regional priorities across justice and skills sectors.

A partnership with **NCFE: Devolution in Reality: The Changing Landscape of Regional Education & skills and Its Local Impact**.

**The Skills for Care webinar** – which discussed the impact on apprenticeship defunding on the health & care sector and how providers can continue to support.

### **CPD Forums**

YLP has expanded its member engagement activity through new forums, campaigns and networking opportunities across the sector. This includes the rebrand of WIFEY to WISE – Women in Skills and Education, alongside bi-monthly Sip and Share coffee mornings, the Women in Skills and Education Spotlight campaign and an International Women’s Day initiative celebrating inspirational women across FE and skills.

YLP has also launched a new Digital Communications & Marketing Forum, including PR-style promotional videos for members shared across YLP and provider social channels to raise awareness of organisations and provision.

In addition to this, the new Future of Apprenticeships Forum has been introduced to support collaboration and discussion around apprenticeship delivery, reform and future skills priorities.

### **Initiatives and social value**

YLP’s newest initiative includes its Mental Health and Wellbeing initiative - this will be focused on strengthening awareness, support and positive workplace wellbeing across the sector through engagement with health and wellbeing specialists.

Alongside this, YLP received a generous donation from The Learning Skills Partnership to support its Period Poverty Campaign, with resources already distributed to providers including Street League and further distribution planned across study programme providers and charities. Regarding our Books for the Inside campaign, NCFE successfully secured Social Impact Funding - providing £500 towards books and learning resources for learners within prison environments.



This quarter has been a busy and productive one for the Cheshire & Warrington Local Provider Network (CWLPN), with strong collaboration across partners and continued progress in strengthening the role of Independent Training Providers (ITPs) in the region's skills landscape.

### **Working with LSIP on the 2026–29 Activity Plan**

CWLPN has been working closely with the Local Skills Improvement Plan (LSIP) team to ensure that the delivery, strengths, and future capacity of ITPs are fully reflected in the new LSIP Activity Plan for 2026–29. This work is helping to highlight the breadth of provision across the network and ensure ITPs are positioned as key contributors to meeting employer demand and local labour market needs.

### **Next Steps for Adult Skills Devolution**

CWLPN hosted an online session with local authorities to outline the next steps for Adult Skills devolution across Cheshire and Warrington. The session provided clarity on emerging priorities, future commissioning approaches, and opportunities for ITPs to shape and contribute to the evolving adult skills landscape. Further updates will follow as the plans progress.

### **Supporting ITPs to Use the Employer Standards Portal**

We have continued our partnership with the Cheshire and Warrington Careers Hub to help ITPs make better use of the Employer Standards Portal. This support aims to strengthen how providers engage with employers, align their offer with school needs, and create more meaningful opportunities for young people. By improving visibility and consistency across the portal, we're helping ITPs build stronger, more effective links with local businesses.

### **Connecting the Network with the New Construction TEC**

CWLPN has also been working with Wigan & Leigh College to ensure ITPs are connected to the development of the new Construction Technical Education Centre (TEC). This collaboration will help ensure that ITP expertise, employer relationships, and specialist training routes are part of the centre's future planning and delivery.



# Update from our Northern Combined Authorities



## *Full steam ahead for MBacc as Government backs our plans for technical education and Good Growth*

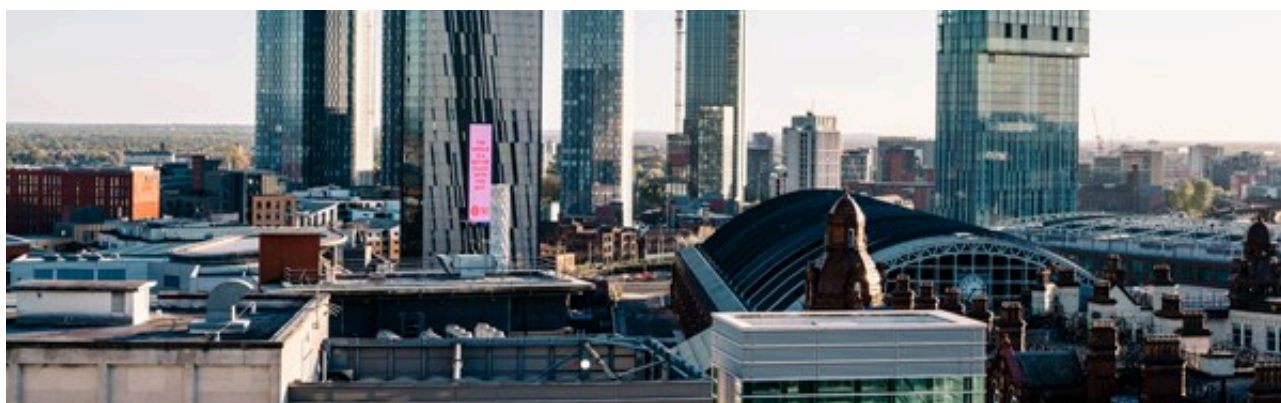
Greater Manchester is expanding the Greater Manchester Bacculaureate (MBacc) with strong Government backing, aiming to transform technical education and link young people directly to high-quality jobs.

The MBacc provides clearer pathways into growing sectors through hands-on experience and closer collaboration between schools, colleges, and employers. With a £10 million investment and plans for 1,000 additional industry placements, the programme will scale further in 2026.

This sits within the region's wider Good Growth strategy, focused on ensuring economic success benefits all communities. An initial £400 million investment will deliver around 3,000 homes, 22,000 jobs, and major regeneration projects.

Supported by devolved powers, Greater Manchester is also investing in housing, transport (including the Bee Network), and innovation to drive inclusive growth.

Together, these plans aim to boost opportunity, reduce inequality, and ensure no young person is left behind.

## *New Event to Help Businesses Access Future Talent*

Small businesses across Hull and East Yorkshire are being offered support to recruit apprentices, trainees, and young talent through a new event hosted by the Hull and East Yorkshire Combined Authority Growth Hub in partnership with the Hull & Humber Chamber of Commerce.

Designed to tackle common barriers such as cost and operational pressures, the event will help businesses better understand apprenticeships, placements, and local talent routes. Attendees can connect with training providers, colleges, universities, and organisations including the Department for Work and Pensions.

Part of Humber Business Week 2026, the event will also cover funding opportunities, policy updates, and practical guidance to help employers confidently invest in future talent.

# *New Director of Employment, Skills and Inclusion appointed at Liverpool City Region Combined Authority*

Liverpool City Region Combined Authority has appointed Claire Blott as its new Director of Employment, Skills and Inclusion, starting on 1 June 2026.

Claire joins the role after four years as Assistant Director of Policy and Strategy, where she led major programmes shaping the City Region’s approach to inclusive growth. Her work has included supporting the early devolution of the Adult Education Budget and helping develop the region’s 10-year Local Growth Plan.

In her new position, Claire will oversee Skills and Careers, as well as Employment Support and Inclusion programmes - ensuring residents can access good jobs, lifelong learning, and the support needed to succeed.

With previous experience across regional and national government, including roles at the Skills Funding Agency and National Apprenticeship Service, she brings strong expertise in policy, commissioning, and partnership working.

Claire described the appointment as an exciting next step at a “pivotal moment,” highlighting new powers and opportunities to build on existing progress. Leaders at the Combined Authority have welcomed her appointment, noting her experience and commitment will be key to delivering inclusive economic growth across the Liverpool City Region.

## *Mayor celebrates major North Sea offshore wind expansion as route to create thousands of new green jobs for the North East*

North East Mayor Kim McGuinness has welcomed a major expansion of offshore wind off the region's coastline, set to unlock billions in investment and support plans to create 25,000 green jobs over the next decade.

The expansion, led by The Crown Estate, will open up at least six gigawatts of offshore wind capacity, placing the North East at the centre of the UK's next phase of clean energy growth. Key ports including Blyth, Sunderland and the Tyne are expected to play a vital role in manufacturing, installation and long-term operations.

The development is projected to drive large-scale private investment and create thousands of skilled jobs across engineering, construction, and supply chains. It also forms part of the Mayor's wider Plan for Green Jobs, backed by over £130 million in public funding to attract further private investment and expand training opportunities.

Alongside job creation, the expansion will strengthen energy security by increasing clean, domestic power and reducing reliance on imported energy.

Regional leaders say the plans position the North East as a national hub for offshore wind - ensuring local people benefit from new opportunities while supporting the UK's transition to a greener economy.

## *New STEM Partnership to Support Young People in South Yorkshire*

New STEM Partnership to Support Young People in South Yorkshire  
South Yorkshire Mayoral Combined Authority (SYMCA) has announced a new partnership with education charity EDT, investing £45,000 to support STEM engagement in schools across Rotherham and Sheffield.

The funding will expand the Industrial Cadets programme, giving students hands-on experience through sustainability-focused projects. Over 12–14 weeks, pupils from several local schools will work in teams with industry mentors, building skills in teamwork, communication, and project management.

The programme will culminate in a final presentation event at Sheffield Hallam University, where students showcase their work to industry assessors. Participants will also take part in activities such as a Carbon Capture workshop, linking classroom learning to real-world challenges.

Leaders say the initiative will help young people gain confidence, develop practical skills, and explore future careers in STEM - supporting the region's wider investment in skills and key industries.

# TEES VALLEY

## *Tour Of Job Prospects And Opportunities For Scholars Taking On Landmark £1m Training Initiative*

A £1 million training initiative is helping prepare young people for future careers in clean energy, with more than 140 students taking part in the Tees Valley Net Zero Industry Scholarship.

The programme provides training in high-demand roles such as welding, electrical engineering, pipefitting, and civil operations, alongside financial support of £100 per week. Delivered in partnership with local colleges and training providers, it combines classroom learning with real-world industry experience.

Scholars have also visited the Teesworks site, gaining first-hand insight into large-scale projects and the opportunities emerging across the region's growing net zero sector.

Backed by industry partners, the initiative equips students with recognised qualifications and practical skills, helping them progress into apprenticeships and long-term careers.

Regional leaders say the scholarship is key to building a skilled local workforce - ensuring communities can benefit from major investment in clean energy and play a central role in the Tees Valley's economic future.

## *Mayor launches bold new drive to close disability employment gap and boost wellbeing and productivity across West Yorkshire*

A major new support package has been launched to help employers recruit and retain people with disabilities and health conditions, as part of a drive to close the employment gap in West Yorkshire.

Backed by a £37 million partnership with the NHS, the Healthy Working Life programme offers fully funded training for at least 250 employers, alongside a practical toolkit covering inclusive recruitment, workplace adjustments, and staff wellbeing.

The initiative aims to make inclusive hiring simpler and more effective, helping businesses access a wider talent pool while improving productivity and retention. Employers can also access additional support, including recruitment grants and connections to skilled candidates.

Regional leaders say the programme will tackle barriers to work, boost economic participation, and support a fairer, more inclusive economy across West Yorkshire.

## *New skills and careers for adult learners*

York and North Yorkshire Mayor David Skaith visited Scarborough TEC to see how adult learners are gaining new skills and moving into employment across the region.

The college is one of more than 20 providers funded through the Adult Skills Fund, which supports adults to retrain, upskill, and progress into work or further learning. Since devolution in 2025, the Combined Authority has taken control of this funding to better meet local needs.

During the visit, the Mayor met students across creative and construction courses, hearing how programmes are building confidence, practical skills, and clear career pathways.

Leaders say the initiative is key to supporting local industries, retaining talent, and helping residents access good-quality jobs - while strengthening the region's economy and future workforce.
